Family Devotion

Consider following up with your student later in the week with the following summary and discussion questions.

Summary: Romans 5:1-11

What's more important than considering what we argue about is to evaluate the root of the conflict in our lives. If we know what's driving us toward conflict, then we can take steps toward making things right. Paul reminded us that we are all in a conflict with God that we cannot solve. Thankfully, God has done everything necessary to solve this conflict. Romans 5:1-11 demonstrates how the gospel brings reconciliation with God to all who believe, proving God's love for us.

Discussion Questions

.01 WHAT HAS GOD DONE TO RESOLVE THE CONFLICT BETWEEN HIMSELF AND SINFUL PEOPLE LIKE YOU AND ME?

.02 HOW CAN WE BE SURE GOD LOVES US (V. 8)? HOW SHOULD KNOWING GOD LOVES US CHANGE THE WAY WE LIVE?

Pray: Thank God for healing the conflict between us and Him. Ask Him to deepen your love for Him.
