## GOD PROTECTS

### as you go

These are simple questions to ask your student as you go home from church or go about your weekly activities.

- .01** If you could have one superpower, what would it be and why?
- .02** How is God's power on display in the verses of Isaiah 31 that you studied this week?

### family DEVOTION

Consider following up with your student later in the week with the following summary and discussion questions.

### summary: ISAIAH 31:1-9

When we stand at the top of a vast overlook and see the valley below, we often feel small. Consider the power that was necessary to create some of the most amazing views on our planet, such as the Rocky Mountains or the Grand Canyon. When we consider such power, we often feel powerless by comparison. It is important to remember, however, that the God who created the universe promises to protect and empower His people, giving them the strength they need to face any circumstance. In Isaiah 31:1-9, we see how Hezekiah lost sight of this and needed to be reminded that God's power is superior to all other powers.

### discussion QUESTIONS

- .01** What did God promise to do for His people (vv. 4-5)? What did He ask of them (vv. 6-9)?
- .02** What is repentance? How does practicing repentance help us draw closer to God and commit ourselves to His purposes for us?

**PRAY:** Ask God to help you acknowledge His power and walk in repentance, fully committing yourself to His glory and His kingdom.

### CENTRAL truth

God's power is superior to all other powers. He is able to protect His people.
